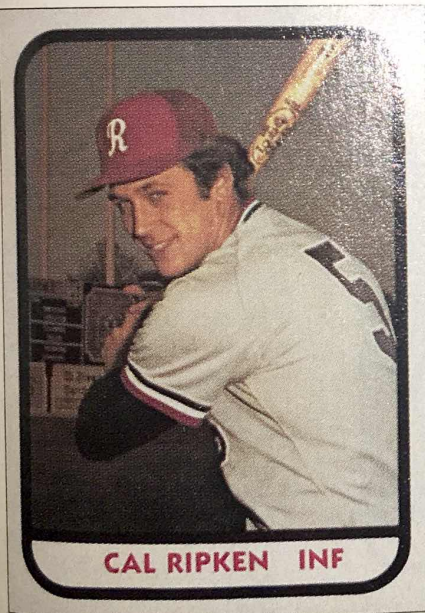


# The Long Way HOME

**W**ith subfreezing temperatures and a bitter wind blowing into Pawtucket's McCoy Stadium, the night of April 18, 1981, appeared ill-suited for baseball.

It turned out to be a night ideally suited for making baseball history.

That evening the Pawtucket Red Sox and Rochester Red

Ten years ago, it took two Triple-A teams 65 days — and 33 innings — to finish a game. When it was over, everyone was in the record books.

Wings, Triple-A affiliates of Boston and Baltimore, respectively, started playing at 8 o'clock and continued until 4:07 a.m. the next morning, Easter Sunday. That's when International League president Harold Cooper called and in-

structed the umpires to suspend play after the 32nd inning of a 2-2 tie.

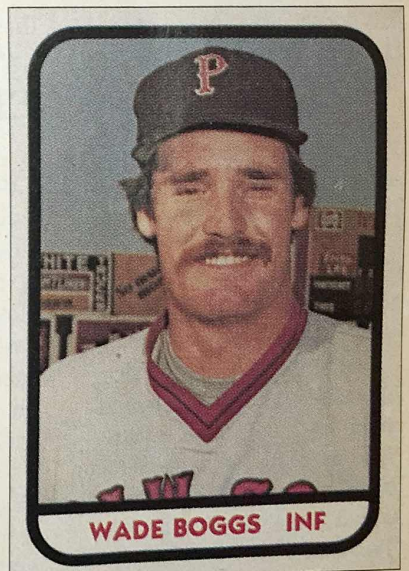
When the game resumed with much hoopla on June 23, it lasted merely 18 minutes more. Pawtucket first baseman Dave Koza's no-out, bases-loaded single to left in the bottom of the 33rd provided the winning run in the longest

game in professional baseball history.

The longest previous professional game was 29 innings, when on June 14, 1966, Miami pinned a 4-3 defeat on St. Petersburg — managed by Sparky Anderson — in a Class A Florida State League game that lasted six hours and 59 minutes.

The improbable event in Pawtucket produced memories of a lifetime for a number of participants. It also provides a perfect event for hobbyists to create their own topical subset.
